



NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAMS



Youngstown State possessed one of the most successful women's basketball programs in the country during the 1990s. From the 1990-91 season through 1999-2000, the Penguins won 196 games and had six 20-win seasons. Five of those 20-win seasons came consecutively from 1995-96 to 1999-2000 during which the Penguins played in the NCAA Tournament three times. YSU also captured five straight regular-season Mid-Continent Conference titles from 1994-95 through 1998-99.

1995-96**First NCAA Tournament Berth**

The 1995-96 season put the Youngstown State women's basketball program on the national map. The Penguins won their second straight Mid-Continent Conference regular-season title - and their first outright title in school history - with four sophomores and one junior in the starting lineup.

As the No. 1 seed, the Penguins breezed through the Mid-Continent Conference tournament by defeating Western Illinois, 69-59, Troy State, 87-67, and Buffalo, 53-43, to earn their first trip to the NCAA Tournament.

YSU was selected as No. 15 seed in "The Dance" and drew No. 2 Penn State. The Penguins hung tough against the Nittany Lions and trailed 42-40 at halftime and 50-49 with 15 minutes left in the game. YSU, however, succumbed to a 19-0 Penn State rally and found themselves down, 69-49. YSU's cinderella season ended with a 94-71 loss to Penn State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

YSU finished the season with a 20-9 ledger overall and finished 14-4 in the Mid-Con. Junior Liz Hauger was named first-team all-conference after leading the Penguins in scoring with 16.4 points per game.

1997-98**First NCAA Tournament Victory**

Fueled by its appearance in the 1996 NCAA Tournament, the 1997-98 YSU women's basketball team was determined to not only make a return trip to "The Dance", but also make some noise.

The Penguins turned in a school-best 28-3 record, won 16 straight games, and finished with a 15-1 mark in the Mid-Continent Conference. Coming off its fourth straight regular-season conference title, YSU earned the No. 1 seed in the Mid-Con Tournament and ran the table with victories over Chicago State, 76-57, Southern Utah, 83-73, and Valparaiso, 78-69, to collect its second NCAA Tournament automatic berth.

YSU earned the No. 12 seed and drew No. 5 Memphis in the first round. The Penguins pulled off the upset of the tournament, downing the Tigers, 91-80, for the school's first NCAA Tournament victory. After a slow start in the second round against North Carolina State, the Penguins saw their magnificent season come to a close with an 88-61 loss to the fourth-seeded Wolfpack.

Four of YSU's five senior starters earned all-conference accolades as Mid-Con Player of the Year Shannon Beach and Ann Marie Martin were named to the first team. Martin led the team with 16.3 points per game while Beach averaged 13.8 points and shot better than 40 percent from 3-point range.

1999-2000**Third NCAA Tournament in five years**





The 1999-2000 team was perhaps the most resilient group of Penguins to reach the NCAA Tournament.

YSU turned in an impressive 19-8 regular-season mark but saw its streak of five consecutive regular-season conference championships snapped. Youngstown State, however, was not deterred from its goal of reaching the NCAA Tournament for the third time in five seasons. The

Penguins swept through the Mid-Continent Conference Tournament by defeating Southern Utah, 84-78 in overtime, Western Illinois, 67-56, and Valparaiso, 73-57, to punch their third "Dance Ticket" with the automatic berth to the NCAA's.

Just as in 1995-96, the Penguins were selected as the No. 15 seed and faced No. 2 Penn State. Although the Penguins set an NCAA East Regional record with 12 3-pointers in a game, the Nittany Lions defeated the Guins, 83-63. YSU earned its fifth-straight 20-win season with an overall mark of 22-9.

Brianne Kenneally was named the Mid-Con Player of the Year and tournament MVP, leading the Penguins with 18.7 points per contest. Three-point specialist Leslie Majewski earned second-team all-conference honors after sinking 70 treys.

CONFERENCE PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

Dorothy Bowers • 1987-88



One of the most recognizable names in the history of Youngstown State women's basketball is that of Dorothy Bowers (1984-88), the school's all-time leading scorer with 2,324 career points.

Bowers' influence on the court and the YSU basketball program was immediately felt.

During her freshman campaign, the Youngstown, Ohio, native was selected to the Ohio Valley Conference All-Freshman Team after scoring 254 points

for an average of 9.4 points per game. She also averaged 7.0 rebounds per game.

In 1985-86, Bowers dominated the hardwood averaging 23.9 points and 11.6 rebounds as a sophomore while shooting a blistering 56 percent from the floor.

That same year she was named second-team All-OVC.



Bowers continued her dominance in 1986-87 as a junior with 24.7 points and 9.7 rebounds per game.

She was named first-team All-OVC after connecting on 50.8 percent of her field goal attempts.

As a senior, Bowers set the school's single-season scoring record with 783 points, breaking the old mark of 710 set by Wanda Grant in 1980-81.

With her 28.0 points and 11.6 rebounds per game, Bowers was named the Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Year.

Bowers also owns the school records for most field goals in a career (977), highest field goal percentage (.544), most points in a single-game (49) and most field goals in a game (21).

Bowers, who owns a career scoring average of 21.5 points per game, also ranks second all-time with 1,083 career rebounds and 370 career free throws made.

Liz Hauger • 1996-97



A catalyst during the Penguins run to their first NCAA Tournament appearance was Liz Hauger (1993-97).

During her junior season in 1995-96, Hauger led the Penguins to a 20-9 record and their first 20-win season since 1990-91. The Penguins also won the Mid-Continent Conference regular season and tournament championships.

Hauger paced the Penguins with a 16.4 scoring average and was named first-team All-Mid-

Continent Conference.


The following season, Hauger turned in an even more impressive campaign. She led the Penguins in scoring for the second straight season with an average of 18.7 points per game and was named the Mid-Con Player of the Year.

The Penguins recorded their second consecutive 20-win season with an overall mark of 23-6 and captured the league's regular season crown. YSU, however, missed out on their second straight NCAA Tournament appearance after losing in the tournament championship game to Troy State, 89-75.

Hauger was also vital in the Penguins first of five straight Mid-Continent Conference championships in 1994-95.

As a sophomore, Hauger was one of the Penguins top offensive threats with a 12.5 scoring average. She connected on 42.2 percent of her field goal attempts and helped guide the Penguins to a 17-11 overall record and a 14-4 league mark. In 1994-95, she was named second-team all-conference.


Hauger currently ranks eighth all-time with 1,468 career points, and third all-time with 328 career free throws made.





CONFERENCE PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

Shannon Beach • 1997-98



Although she missed most of her first two seasons due to knee injuries, Shannon Beach (1993-98) was an impact player for the Penguins during their first two trips to the NCAA Tournament.

In 1995-96 as a redshirt sophomore, Beach was an essential ingredient in the Penguins run to the NCAA.

She averaged 10.5 points and 8.6 rebounds per game and was also named the Mid-Continent Conference Tournament Most Valuable Player after defeating Buffalo, 53-43, in the championship game.

Beach earned second-team all-conference accolades as a junior after helping the Penguins to a 23-6 record in 1996-97. Her 13.7 points per game ranked fourth on the squad but she led the team in rebounding with 8.6 boards per game.

It was this season when Beach developed into a dangerous three-point shooter, connecting on 57-of-152 three-point attempts.


As a senior, Beach was an integral part of the team that set the school record for most wins in a season with a 28-3 mark in 1997-98. That same year, Youngstown State advanced to the second

round of the NCAA Tournament after upsetting Memphis, 91-80.

Beach, who missed four games that season, was one of top three-point shooters in the conference and drilled 40.7 percent of her three-point attempts.

The native of Atwater, Ohio, became the second straight YSU player to earn the Mid-Continent Conference Player of the Year Award after averaging 13.8 points and 5.5 rebounds per game.

Beach currently ranks 13th on the all-time scoring list with 1,148 career points and is tied for third all-time with 146 career three-pointers.

During her freshman season in 1997-98, people caught a glimpse of what the future had in store for Brianne Kenneally (1997-2001).

When senior Shannon Beach missed four games due to knee surgery, Kenneally replaced her in the starting lineup and the Penguins never skipped a beat. In the five games Kenneally started that season, she averaged an impressive 11.2 points per game.

Even when she was relegated back to her reserve role, Kenneally made an impact in the Penguins' biggest games of the season. The Brecksville, Ohio, native helped secure the Penguins' 28-3 record; was named to the Mid-Con's All-Newcomer Team; and averaged 12.5 points per game in two NCAA Tournament games.

Her sophomore season saw even more accolades come her way as she led the Penguins with 16.3 points per game and finished 15th in the nation with an 85.9 free throw percentage. Kenneally was then named the Mid-Con's Player of the Year.

As a junior in 1999-2000, Kenneally racked up a league-best 18.7 points per game to lead the Penguins to a 22-9 mark, their fifth straight 20-win season. The 5-foot-9 guard won the league's Player of the Year Award for the second consecutive year and was named MVP of the Mid-Con Tournament after leading YSU to its third NCAA Tournament appearance.

Kenneally's final season was marked with triumph and tragedy as she was ranked third in the nation with a 24.5 scoring average when a knee injury ended her career.

She ranks seventh on the all-time scoring list with 1,471 points and owns the career mark for most free throws made with 373.






