The facility would also provide a significantly prolonged practice season to meet the challenge of the elevated level of competition YSU seeks to embrace.

Proceed down Route 62 100 yards - McCune Park is on the right. **From Route 224 - Boardman, Ohio:** Go West on Route 224 seven miles. Turn right on Routes 46 and 62. Head north two miles and turn right on Route 62 (Shields Road). Proceed down Route 62 100 yards - McCune Park is on the right. **From Route 224 - Canton, Ohio:** Go East on Route 224 into the center of Canfield. Turn left (North) on Routes 46 and 62. Head North two miles and turn right on Route 62 (Shields Road). 2011 SEASON OUTLOOK

Guins' Hope Experience, Chemistry Leads to Turnaround

As the Youngstown State softball team enters the 2011 season, two aspects of the squad stand out dramatically to third-year Head Coach Brian Campbell - experience and team chemistry.

The Penguins begin the year with five players that have played in 100 games or more, seven that have appeared in at least 50 contests, and yet, only have three seniors.

"Our experience is going to be one of our strengths this season, if not the biggest strength of our team," Campbell said. "We finally have a ballclub that has a tremendous amount of experience in the field and in the batting lineup."

While the experience factor runs deep regarding the batting order and the position players, it is lacking in the pitching circle.

Although the Guins have four pitchers listed on the roster, only one has college pitching experience and only 49.2 innings pitched at that.

"The last two seasons, we relied heavily on Cheryl Cale," Campbell said. "Now, although we are young, we have four pitchers that complement each other well."

"Hopefully we will not have to rely just on one pitcher."

Campbell is also impressed with the way the team works and competes together.

According to Campbell, the Guins have accepted their roles on the team but still push each other.

"Our players are very supportive of each other," Campbell said. "They compete hard against one another, but, at the same time, want to see their teammates perform well."

Infield

Like a season ago, the Guins' infield remains intact and has 50 games or more experience.

The only hole to fill will be at third base with sophomore Vicky Rumph moving behind the plate a portion of the time.

Senior Kim Klonowski, who has played in 130 games, is back for her third straight season starting at first base.

Klonowski, a Second-Team All-Horizon League pick in 2009, batted .297 but drove in a team-high 35 runs last year. She also ranked third on the team with seven home runs.

Klonowski also ranks fifth in school history with 16 career home runs.

Senior Kristina Rendle is in her fourth season playing second base for Campbell after transferring to YSU before the start of the 2009 season.

Rendle has appeared in a total of 142 college games and batted .274 last season - a 42 point spike in her batting average from the 2009 campaign.

Rendle's middle infield counterpart at short-stop for the third straight campaign is junior Kristen Philen. Philen has appeared in 100 straight games at the position, and arguably was the most improved player on the 2010 team.

Philen improved her batting average 117 points to .317 in 2010 from .200 in 2009. She also drove in 10 more runs, hit four more doubles

and one more home run than during her initial campaign. Philen drilled 10 doubles with three home runs and 22 runs batted in last season.

For the third straight season, a new face will be charged with stabilizing the hot corner.

Freshman Samantha Snodgrass, the 2010 West Virginia Gatorade Player of the Year, is slated to see a majority of action at third base.

Last season, Snodgrass was named the West Virginia Sportwriters' Player of the Year and earned first-team all-state honors as a senior. She led Saint Albans to a state championship as a senior and set the Saint Albans single-season records for most home runs (13) and RBIs (55). She batted .443 with 13 home runs and 55 runs batted while going 25-1 with a 0.37 earned run average. She also struck out 271 in 151 inning pitched.

Rumph, who was named to the Horizon League All-Newcomer Team, will also see action at third base.

Catcher

The catching duties this season will most likely be split between Rumph and junior Amanda Palmore.

Rumph tied for the team lead with eight home runs and tied for second on the team with 26 runs batted in.

Palmore turned in an improved sophomore season at the plate batting .261 - 88 points above her freshman year batting average - with three home runs and five doubles.

Outfield

In the outfield, two of the three slots will be occupied by two juniors that have each played the last 100 games in their respective positions - center fielder Haley Thomas and right fielder Jordan Ingalls.

Thomas turned in one of the best offensive seasons by a Penguin outfielder in the school's history.

Thomas, who set the single-season runs scored mark with 41 in 2010, batted .370 with 10 doubles, eight home runs and six triples. Her .648 slugging percentage ranks fourth on the YSU single-season list and her 61 hits rank tied for second.

Ingalls batted .335 with eight doubles and four home runs. She also tied for second on the team with 26 runs batted in.

A career .333 hitter, Ingalls also tallied a career-best 52 hits during her sophomore campaign.

Sophomores Sarah Gabel and Caroline Krombach as well as freshman Courtney Ewing will be in a highly-competitive battle to see who takes the reigns in the vacant left-field slot.

Krombach, a speedy left-handed hitter, finished the 2010 season on a strong note and batted .291 on the year.

Gabel appeared in 37 games with 22 starts and batted .169 with a home run and seven runs batted in.

Senior Erin Gilmour and freshmen Shayla



Haley Thomas led the Guins with a .370 batting average with 24 extra-base hits in 2010.

DeCapita and Kelly Fox are also competing for time in the outfield.

"This year we have an overall experienced crew in outfield," Campbell said. "That group brings us power, speed and the ability to hit for average on the offensive side."

"Defensively, all of our outfielders can cover a lot of territory which should help our pitchers tremendously."

Pitchers

The biggest question mark heading into the 2011 campaign is in the circle.

The Guins have just one pitcher returning from the 2010 squad - sophomore Hana Somogyi - and she pitched just 49.2 innings last season. Somogyi went 1-7 last season and struck out 15 batters.

Along with Somogyi, the Guins will look to freshmen Casey Crozier, Haley Knight and Snodgrass to hurl the majority of the innings.

Crozier set the school single-season record with 259 strikeouts as a junior, which was the second most in the state, and posted an earned run average of 1.36.

Knight went 13-4 with a 1.59 earned-run average, 131 strikeouts in 110 innings pitched as a senior and held opponents to a .198 batting average.

Designated Player

The Guins have a myriad of choices to use as the designated player in 2011. If not playing in left field, Gabel or Krombach could be utilized in this role.

Also, freshman Sarah Ingalls will be competing for time in spot in the lineup.

Ingalls was named first-team all-conference four times, and batted .527 as a freshman, .510 as a sophomore, .418 as a junior and .547 as a senior. She also set the Ursuline single-season records for most home runs (7) and most RBIs (47) as a senior.

HEAD COACH BRIAN CAMPBELL



Now in his third season at the helm of the Youngstown State is Brian Campbell. Campbell, the winningest softball coach in Tiffin University history, was named the ninth Head Coach of the Youngstown State University softball program on June 17, 2008.

Campbell, who posted his 300th career victory on April 4, 2010, has won 307 games in 10 years as a head coach.

In 2010, Campbell guided the Penguins to one of their best offensive seasons in school history and nearly doubled their win total from the previous season. The Penguins set the school record for highest team batting average (.296) and most hits in a season (402) and tied the school mark for most home runs in a season (39).

The Guins also scored the second-highest number of runs in school history (217) and also drove in the second-highest number of runs (188) in a season.

Vicky Rumph was named to the Horizon League All-Newcomer Team after batting .327 with 26 runs batted and tying for the team lead with eight home runs.

Haley Thomas led the team with a .370 batting average with 10 doubles, six triples and eight home runs, and her .648 slugging percentage was the fourth-highest single-season mark in school history.

In 2009, Kim Klonowski was named to the All-Horizon League Second-Team after posting a .329 batting average with 10 doubles, eight home runs and 32 runs batted in.

Beginning in August of 2010, Campbell was named to a two-year term on the NFCA Division I Head Coaches Committee to represent the Horizon League.

Campbell is also in the first year of a three-year term on the NCAA Regional Softball Rankings Committee for the Mideast Region.

Campbell, who spent eight years as head coach and 12 years overall working with the Lady Dragons' softball program, posted an impressive 285-129-1 overall record and a .688 winning percentage during his tenure.

Campbell transitioned Tiffin into an NCAA Division II program from the NAIA, and in its first season as an NCAA Division II, Independent the Dragons finished with a 27-14-1 record. Tiffin was ranked as high as 32nd in the National Fastpitch Coaches' Association (NFCA) national polls in 2008 while moving as high as 13th in the NAIA national rankings in 2007.

Campbell, who has averaged 36 wins per season, was named American Midwest Conference (AMC) North Coach of the Year in 2007 for the third consecutive season after leading the Dragons to a 37-11 mark, a Region IX Championship and their second straight appearance in the NAIA National Softball Tournament.

In 2006, Campbell guided Tiffin to an impressive 57-11 overall record and the program's first Region IX title and first NAIA National Tournament appearance.

Campbell led Tiffin to four-consecutive AMC North Championships from 2004 to 2007 and the AMC Championship in 2002 with a 25-3 conference record and a 31-17 overall mark.



During the 2005 campaign, the Dragons compiled a 34-22 overall mark and an 11-1 conference record on the way to their third conference title in four years.

Campbell led Tiffin to a perfect 14-0 conference record and a 39-15 overall mark during the 2004 AMC North Championship season.

The Dragons earned conference runner-up honors in 2003 with a 33-20 overall mark and a 16-4 league record. They won their first league title in 2002 after posting a 25-3 conference record and a 31-17 overall mark.

After four seasons as an assistant coach, Campbell took over the Tiffin program in 2001 and posted a 27-19 overall record.

Campbell has coached 39 All-Conference selections, including 2007 Region and Conference Pitcher of the Year Krista Sowers, 2006 AMC North Player of the Year Kristina Schweikert, 2005 AMC North Player of the Year Denita Robinson, 2005 AMC North Pitcher of the Year and 2004 AMC North Player of the Year Rachel Richardson and 2002 AMC Player of the Year Kate Siroky.

Campbell, who also served as Assistant Athletic Director, is a 1994 graduate of Tiffin University with a degree in criminal justice. He also has a master's degree in criminal justice from Tiffin.

Campbell played for the Tiffin football team from 1990-94 on the offensive line, helping to lead the Dragons to their first-ever National Tournament appearance.

He also served as an assistant football coach from 1997-2000 and was an assistant coach at Newark High School.

He and his wife, Kristi, have a daughter, Courtney.

Third Season

Tiffany Patteson, the most-decorated softball player in Youngstown State history, enters her third season as an assistant softball coach at her alma mater.

Patteson, the 2006 YSU-Vindicator Female Athlete of the Year, spent the 2008 season as a graduate assistant coach at Tiffin, where she helped guide the Dragons

to a 27-14-1 record in their inaugural season as an NCAA Division II squad.

A four-year letterwinner at Youngstown State from 2003-06, Patteson served as a student assistant coach during the 2007 while completing her degree.

Patteson's career numbers are some of the best in the history of the Horizon League as well. She ranks third in triples, fifth in doubles, ninth in hits and 10th in batting average.

Her school single-season record of nine triples in 2003 ranks tied for second on the Horizon League single-season list while her school mark of 19 doubles in 2004 is tied for seventh in league history.

Patteson, a four-time All-Horizon League selection, owns several Youngstown State all-time records, including games played (205), games started (205), hits (231), at-bats (664), doubles (56), triples (18), walks (84) and runs scored (121). Patteson also ranks second all-time in batting average (.347) and fourth all-time with 93 runs batted in. She is the only player in school history to play in more than 200 games.

She was a first-team All-Horizon League selection in 2003 and 2004 and earned second-team honors in 2005 and 2006. She was also named to the Horizon League All-Newcomer Team in 2003.

In 2006, Patteson led the team with a .361 batting average, three triples and 14 doubles and blasted a walk-off home run in the bottom of the seventh inning against UIC to give YSU a 2-1 win and its first Horizon League Tournament Championship and NCAA Regional Tournament berth. She was named to the all-tournament team after batting .467 with two doubles, a home run and four runs batted in.

Patteson earned a bachelor's degree in exercise science from Youngstown State in 2007 and earned an MBA degree from Tiffin in 2009.

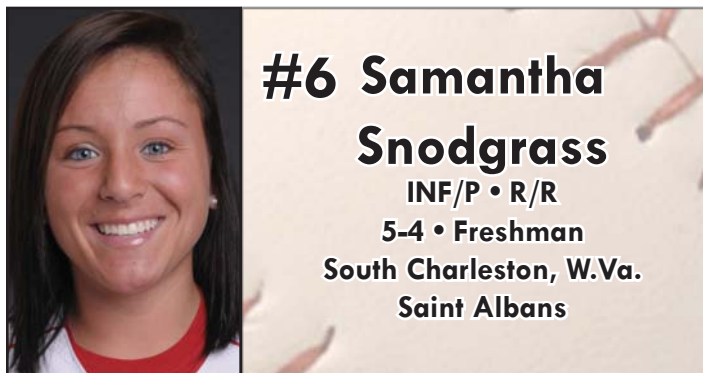
